Stellar Brothers was a co-op for men which firmly believed in perpetuating the stable, traditional forms of activity and enjoyment. Instead of picketing or staging sit-ins, the men of Stellar Brothers demonstrated their ability for civic duty in such activities as SCA and Old Masters. For physical exercise, participation in sports competition was substituted for protest marches. Entertainment for the men of Stellar Brothers came not in the form of happenings or riots, but as trade parties and Christmas dances with their sister co-ops. Lesson: all activists need not be demonstrators.

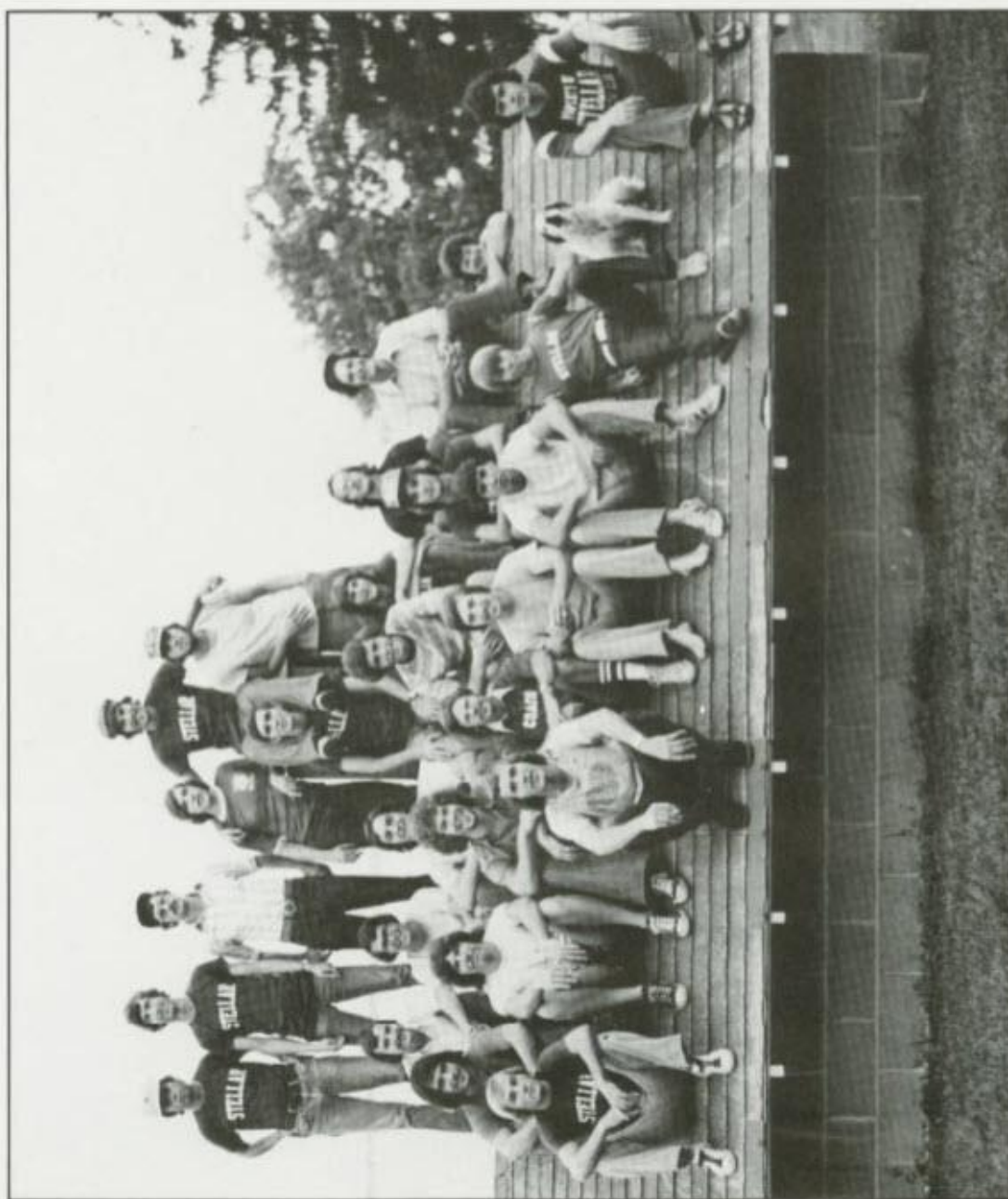
